## PROPOSED ACTIVITIES FOR 9/1/01 TO 8/31/02 (Activities must occur between dates)

Several years of interdisciplinary collaboration between AMD&ART staff, the design team, the community, and contractors have resulted in the construction of an acid mine drainage (AMD) treatment system and finalized plans for a community park in Vintondale, PA. In the next year, the "finishing touches" will be applied, and the park will be constructed. In addition, AMD&ART hopes to collaborate with other groups interested in AMD remediation to bring its experience and expertise in combining treatment systems with artful interpretation.

In the next year, artist Peter Richards and historian T. Allan Comp will complete the design and construction of the mine portal memorial at the entrance to the former Mine Portal # 6. A granite façade of the portal will be sandblasted with etchings of the entrance and miners entering the mine. It will provide artistic and historic interpretation of the coal-mining heritage and the people who contributed to it. Richards and Comp are also collaborating on the construction of the "Great Map," a portrayal of the former Vintondale Colliery and its activities applied to a platform just above what is now the constructed wetlands area of the site. A Pennsylvania Humanities Council (PHC) grant provides funding for the map. These are both scheduled for completion in the summer of 2002. Both endeavors will have high visibility because they abut the Ghost Town Trail, a rail-to-trail that attracts approximately 75,000 visitors per year.

AMD&ART will sponsor a student competition, the "Water Celebration," during the spring semester. The purpose of the competition is to find an appropriate artistic interpretation to be located at the site where clean water is returned to the stream after it has been through the treatment system. A jury of nationally recognized artists, community residents, and other partners will be selected. The winner will be announced in late spring, and construction is scheduled for the summer of 2002.

The remodeling phase of the environmental education center in Vintondale is complete. The education coordinator will continue to develop programming for school groups and the general population. A new AmeriCorps staff member, a graphic designer, will work with the education coordinator to develop informative and attractive signs for the education center. The designer also will take over responsibility for maintaining AMD&ART's website.

Sculptor Angelo Ciotti and T. Allan Comp will continue to develop conceptual and construction plans for the grading and sculpture of an overlook to be situated on the large bony pile bordering the treatment site at its beginning. AMD&ART will strengthen partnerships with contractors, who first will remove the usable coal for regeneration, and with environmental regulators, who will oversee the reclamation efforts.

The planting of the wetlands will begin in October and continue in the spring. The wetlands area covers over six acres; small groups of AMD&ART staff, students, residents, and volunteers will plant sections at a time. AMD&ART will continue to pursue funding for the construction of the baseball and soccer fields.

A member of the AMD&ART Design Team, Kathy Poole, L.A., is working with the Dark Shade Brownfields Project staff on a conceptual design for a recreational park in Central City, PA. She and the staff will hold workshops in the community and will build partnerships with key groups.

AMD&ART will continue to work with the Monday Creek Restoration Project on an AMD remediation project in Murray City, OH. The two parties hope to set up a cooperative agreement whereby AMD&ART will provide technical support to the construction of the treatment site. The project is a result of the partnership between the Office of Surface Mining and the National Endowments for the Arts.

The Pennsylvania Council on the Arts will help support the efforts of AMD&ART as it completes the final phases of the Vintondale AMD treatment site. These "finishing touches" will enhance the beauty of the site and bring to all who see it a greater sense of historical perspective and environmental restoration.
