PROPOSED ACTIVITIES FOR 9/3/02 TO 8/31/03(Activities must occur between dates)

AMD&ART has completed the construction of the acid mine drainage (AMD) treatment system in Vintondale, PA during the past year with the excavation and planting of the wetlands. Now, the AMD drains into a series of ponds, or cells, where biological and chemical reactions remove many contaminants, such as iron and aluminum, from the water. The water then flows into the wetlands where the plants further remove toxins before the water is discharged into the stream. Interpretive signs have been placed along the treatment ponds explaining the processes involved.

The PCA funding will help pay for design services in several areas of the Park: the Mine Portal Memorial, the Litmus Garden, and the Interpretive Map. In addition, the funds will be used for improvements in the design of our web site. Lastly, the funds will provide money for much-needed operating expenses.

Much work has been accomplished in the past year. Preliminary plans have been made for the design of the mine portal memorial at the entrance to the former Mine Portal #6, where a granite façade of the portal will display the etching of human figures on black granite. More research must be done to find the appropriate image and to locate an artisan to complete the task.

Another series of interpretive signs need to be designed for placement in the litmus garden. These signs will identify the various native trees that have been planted along the treatment ponds, artistically displaying fall colors corresponding with the color of the water from red to orange to blue-green as it flows through the system and is cleansed.

The Pennsylvania Council on the Arts will help support the efforts of AMD&ART as it completes the final phases of the Vintondale AMD treatment site. These "finishing touches" will enhance the beauty of the site and bring to all who see it a greater sense of historical perspective and environmental restoration.

Dear Rosalyn Robitaille,

The Pennsylvania Council on the Arts congratulates you on receiving an Arts Organization and Arts Program (AOAP) grant.

Pennsylvania is experiencing its first recession in ten years. As a result of the economic downturn and the decrease in state government revenues, the budgets of all state agencies have been reduced this year. Pennsylvania's state arts funding in the form of the annual appropriation for grants-to-the-arts has gone from \$15.4 million to \$14 million which has resulted in reductions in grant amounts to most AOAP organizations as well as in the reduction, suspension or postponement of other PCA programs, initiatives and services.

As a result of the decrease in the grants appropriation, your award amount has decreased. Further, the Council decided to make an adjustment in this year's award amounts for those AOAP grantees that received the mid-year 22% reduction in their FY2001-2002 grants. Since your award was unaffected by the freeze last year, this adjustment means you are seeing a reduced grant amount that is larger than the reduction in the overall grants appropriation. Those affected by the freeze are still receiving reduced grants this year, but by a smaller amount.

The PCA has made a great deal of progress during the past seven years – reaching greater and greater numbers of Pennsylvanians with more and more quality arts experiences. The reduction in state arts funding does not diminish in any way the progress made or impede future advances and accomplishments.

Our colleagues across the country are also experiencing decreases in funding, some have seen proposed cuts in funding of more than 50% of last year's levels! I continue to urge you to inform and involve your legislators and to invite them and their staff to your activities so they may see firsthand the benefits of state arts funding.

We appreciate the patience and support you have demonstrated over this difficult period. If you have questions, please contact your Program Director to discuss in more detail the funding formula for AOAP.
